

25 Facebook Posts for FAFSA Completion

- 1. The new FAFSA for the 2014-15 school year is now available! Let the funds begin: www.fafsa.gov
- 2. One thing you don't need for the FAFSA? Money! Remember, the FAFSA is FREE when you use the official .gov site: www.fafsa.gov
- 3. The first "F" in FAFSA stands for FREE. You never have to pay to complete the application. Find the official FAFSA here: www.fafsa.gov
- 4. Federal Student Aid has \$150 billion to help you pay for college. The only way to qualify is to fill out the FAFSA. Don't leave \$ on the table: www.fafsa.gov
- 5. Some financial aid is awarded on a 1st come, 1st served basis, so complete the FAFSA as soon as possible. Check your school & state FAFSA deadlines here: http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/deadlines.htm
- 6. On average, you can complete the online FAFSA in just 23 minutes! That's probably less time than it takes to watch your favorite TV show. So, what are you waiting for? Complete the FAFSA today: www.fafsa.gov.
- 7. In order to sign and submit your FAFSA online, you'll need a Federal Student Aid PIN. Don't have one? Apply: https://pin.ed.gov/PINWebApp/PINServlet?state=100&locale=en US
- 8. There's NO income cut-off for federal student aid: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=K8JuaYVJ_LE. Everyone should fill out the FAFSA: www.fafsa.gov

- 11. Haven't filed taxes yet? You can still complete the 2014-15 FAFSA! Just use your 2012 taxes to estimate the information for now, and then update your FAFSA once you have filed your 2013 taxes. Here's how: http://studentaid.ed.gov/fafsa/filling-out?sf8340064=1#financial-info
- 12. You do NOT need to wait until you file your taxes to complete the FAFSA. Complete the FAFSA using income estimates, and then update the FAFSA once you file your taxes. Here's how: http://studentaid.ed.gov/fafsa/filling-out#financial-info

- 13. Completing the FAFSA is not a one-time thing. You must complete a FAFSA each school year. The good news? If you have completed the FAFSA in the past, a lot of your info will roll-over automatically. Try it: www.fafsa.gov

- 19. March is a huge month for FAFSA deadlines! Make sure you check both your state AND school deadlines and apply by whichever comes first: http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/deadlines.htm
