- 45.5% of Low-income High School Graduates enroll in postsecondary education
- 63.8% of Middle-income High School Graduates enroll in postsecondary education
- An educated workforce is a stronger economy





What do Middle School Students Receive?


- Multi-tiered curriculum that targets each grade level with focus on the future




Why did we teach and implement these lessons and activities?
