So whether virtually or safely in person, I hope you enjoy celebrating with us this College Signing Day!



What is College Signing Day?



College Signing Day is an opportunity to celebrate students committing to pursue their education past high school. Whether a student wants to earn a two-year degree, a four-year degree, a certificate or industry-recognized credential, transfer to a new institution, or enlist in the military, we want to celebrate them! In the past, we've celebrated on May 1, but you should celebrate on a date that works best for your community and your students.



Reach Higher was launched at a College Signing Day event in San Antonio, Texas, in 2014. The community there celebrated all of their students' goals for higher education, and Mrs. Obama joined in the celebrations. This set the standard to continue the celebration in schools and districts all across the country for years to come!

Recognizing all Post-Secondary Plans



Over the last 8 years, thousands of schools and organizations have celebrated millions of students.



How to Celebrate College Signing Day

1. Register at CollegeSigningDay.BetterMakeRoom.org

How to Host a Digital College Signing Day

There are so many ways to engage your students virtually!

Invite high school alumni, college and trade school representatives, or a keynote speaker to speak with your students. Ask each student to record a video announcing where they are going and share it online!

Get your ninth, tenth, and eleventh graders involved, too! Ask them to create a Common App account and add 5 colleges to their list to start researching schools. This will help them get ready to complete college applications next year since their information will save and roll over!

How to Celebrate on Social Media

Using social media is a fun way to highlight your students and their accomplishments.

How to Celebrate with Elementary and Middle School Students

This is a great opportunity for college exploration!

Have a Career Day! Invite family or community members to come in to talk about their careers. Organize a college fair during virtual lunch or after school, if in person.

Share photos or drawings of students in a cap and gown with signs depicting what they want to be when they grow up.

Invite alumni who are in college to speak to students about their experiences.


Share information with families about exploring colleges online while at home.

Design a virtual bulletin board with school staff photos and a map of where they attended college.

Need More Inspiration?

You can host a safe in-person or virtual event where your students can write anonymous letters of advice to current juniors. The juniors can open the letters on the first day of their senior year!
