




FIGURE 8. Admission Rates to UC Berkeley, by Race/Ethnicity, Fall Freshman Classes, 1994-1998 Source: Campaign for College Opportunity, 2015.




FIGURE 7. First-Time Non-International Freshman Enrollment at California Public Postsecondary Institutions, 2015, by Institution Type Source: California Department of Education, 2017; National Center for Education Statistics, 2017.

















In 2018, only 54% of California's graduating seniors completed the FAFSA or CA Dream Act.<sup>4</sup>

# Why this is an equity issue?

High schools with high concentrations of low-income students and students of color have some of the lowest financial aid application rates in the state.<sup>4</sup>

A statewide policy solution for high schools and school districts to ensure that every student completes a financial aid application before they graduate.

### STUDENTS CAN MEET THE REQUIREMENT BY DOING ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:


- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Complete a California Dream Act Application
- Parent or legal guardian submits a opt-out form to the high school or school district
- The high school or school district may exempt a student from submitting a financial aid application

Passing Assembly Bill 1617 (Reyes) is a statewide policy solution to ensure that every student has the pportunity to apply for financial aid is our biggest lever.


