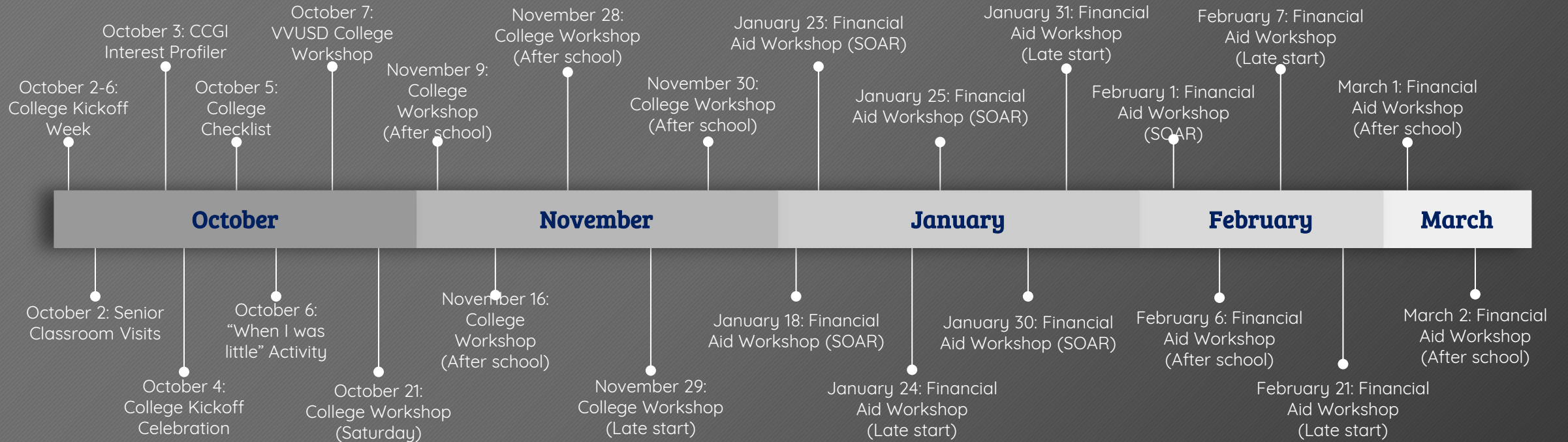

What is College Season Kickoff?

College Kickoff focuses on college and career readiness through presentations, classroom visits, workshops, and student meetings with their counselors. Our goal is to have graduates well prepared for college and their careers. College Season kicks off October 2nd.

Families can also promote College Kickoff:

- Provide necessary information and documentation to ensure students are able to navigate different types of applications
- Research college affordability, career interests, and college options with your students
- Visit a local college campus, free tours are available
- Check your school's website for College Kickoff events

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is a form that can be prepared annually by prospective college students in the U.S. to determine their eligibility for student financial aid.

The FAFSA is a VVUSD graduation requirement, and must be completed by all 12th grade students

California College Guidance Initiative

The California College Guidance Initiative (CCGI) works to ensure that all 6th-12th grade students in California have access to a systematic baseline of guidance and support as they plan, prepare, and pay for post-secondary education and training.

CCGI objectives:

1. All high school seniors graduate with a thoughtful, well-informed, post-secondary plan
2. Students' academic transcript, unique identifier, and college and career planning data follow them in a manner that reduces information gaps that hinder student success
3. We believe in increased student access and success and strive to provide student opportunities and develop programs with these values at the core

While CCGI offers many tools for seniors, it can be beneficial for students 9th through 11th that are planning their future. We will be meeting with all grade levels in the weeks to come, and registering students for their own CCGI account.

- Conduct college searches
- Explore majors
- Explore careers
- Take a career interest survey
- Learn about financial aid options

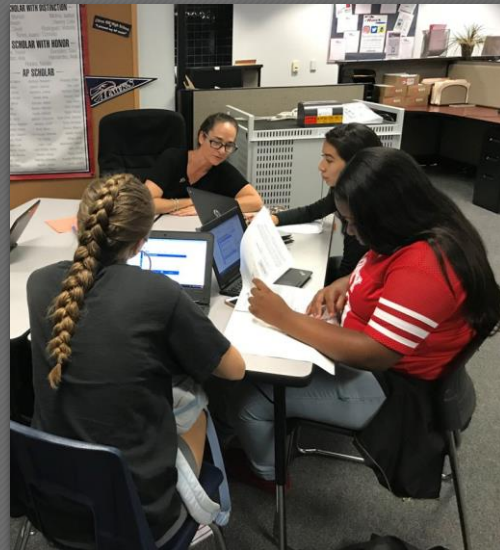
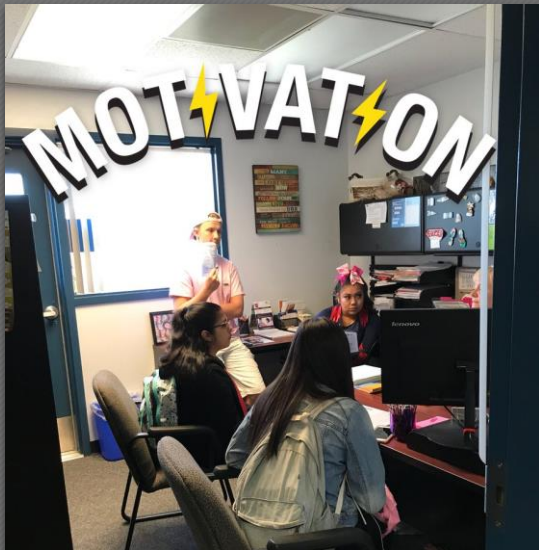
