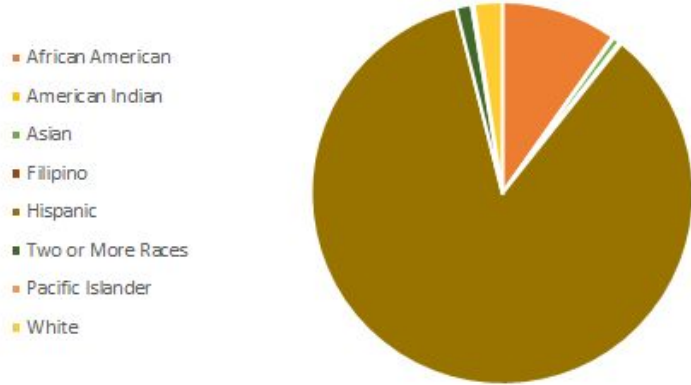

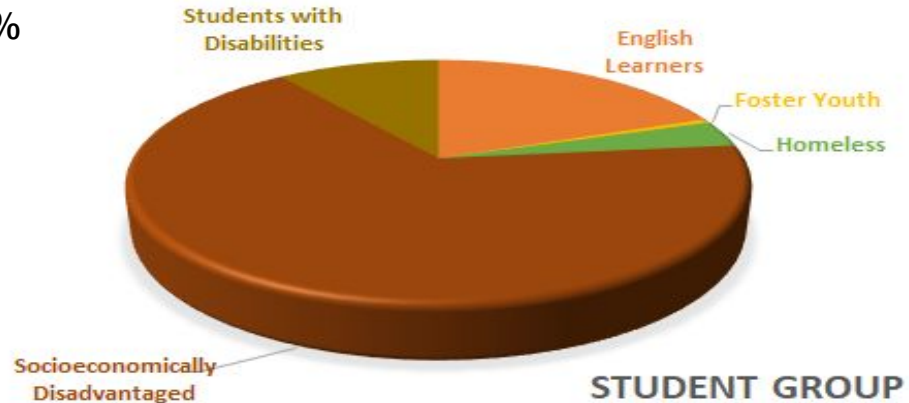

Possible Talking Points:

- In Jr. High did you know what you wanted to be when you grew up?
- In High School did you know what you wanted to do/study?
- What you understood the purpose of the SAT to be.
- Did you apply to a 4 year University after High School or attend a Jr. College?
- Discuss the difference between a 4 year University and a 2 Year Community College.
- What was your Major?
- How did you prepare to and eventually finance your college experience?
- How long did it take you complete your degree?
- Did you live on campus or commute?
- What extracurricular activities (clubs, sports, dorm activities) did you participate in?
- When you graduated, what did that mean to you?
- Did you get a job in the field you originally studied?
- Looking back, are there any things you would have changed about your personal college journey?

PSAT: ELA



- The purpose of the PSAT 8/9 is to establish a starting point in terms of college and career readiness as students transition to high school. **It's a way for students to practice for the PSAT 10, the PSAT/NMSQT, and the SAT that you take in High School.**
- Because there's no penalty for guessing, your raw score is the number of questions you answered correctly.
- PSAT 8/9 has two sections: an evidence-based reading and writing section and a math section. The reading and writing section includes two tests, one for each subject. The entire PSAT 8/9 takes 2 hours and 35 minutes to complete, including a ten minute break.

GPA CALCULATION: MATH

THE FORMULA

- Step 1
 - Figure out your points for each of your class grades
 - Add up your points
- Step 2
 - Divide your total points by the number of classes

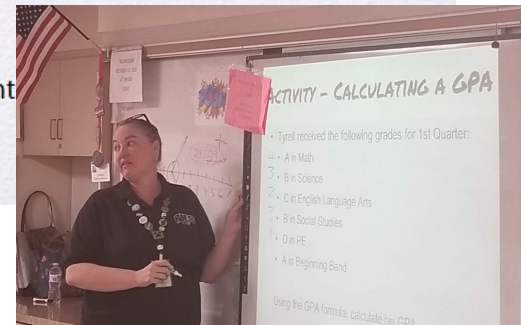
Example- $A+B+B+A+C+A=20$ points

$20 \text{ points} / 6 \text{ classes} = 3.33$

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

To graduate from a comprehensive high school a student must complete:

Total semester units in grades 9-12 for graduation → 220

Specific units to be completed include:

1. English/Language Arts.....	40
2. History/Social Science as follows:.....	30
*US History and Geography.....	10
*World History and Culture.....	10
*American Government and Civics.....	5
*Economics.....	5
3. Mathematics.....	30
4. Science (including embedded or integrated Sciences).....	30
5. Physical Education.....	*20
6. Career Technical Education, Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA),	20
Foreign Language as follows:	
*Career Technical Education or 4 th year Science.....	10
*VAPA or Foreign Language.....	10
7. Electives.....	50

* Students may take only two classes of physical education per semester (including Sports PE). Only 40 credits of P.E. may be used for graduation. A ninth grade P.E. course is required for all ninth grade students. The remaining Physical Education credits may be earned from participation in P.E., 10-12, JROTC, Marching Band and/or Pageantry Production.

4 Year College "A-G" s

A. History	20 credits (2 years)
B. English	40 credits (4 years)
C. Mathematics (prefer 4 yrs.)	30 credits (3 years)
D. Laboratory Science-Biology & Chem/Physics	20 credits (2 years)
E. Foreign Language	20 credits (2 years)
F. Visual or Performing Arts	10 credits (1 year)
G. College Prep Elective	10 credits (1 year)
