

## Core Curriculum - Socio-Emotional SMART Goal

Specific Issue: What is the specific issue based on our school's data?	Based on school data, and as the student population has increased, crisis involving suicide assessments has similarly increased.  Number of suicide interventions; approximately 74.6% of students rated their daily stress level as 3 or higher out of the possible 5; 66.6% of students reported that their daily stress level as being consistent from anywhere from 3 months to a year or longer.
Attainable: What outcome would stretch us but is still attainable?	5% decrease in counseling referrals for self-harm assessment.
Time Bound: When will our goal be accomplished?	By end of calendar school year, i.e. June 2017
Measurable: How will we measure the effectiveness of our interventions?	<ul> <li>Pre/Post tests</li> <li>Number of counseling referrals as well as reasons for counseling referral</li> <li>Completed Stress Management Plan handouts</li> </ul>
Results-Oriented: Is the goal reported in results-oriented data (process, perception and outcome)?	Process: each 11 <sup>th</sup> grade student will receive counseling intern-made lesson presented to them with more information on stress management and self-care.  Perception: Pre/Post tests will show growth-in knowledge regarding related terms, change in attitude towards investing in self-care and ability to formulate a stress management plan.  Outcome: Will show a decreased percentage of counseling referrals coded for suicidal ideation.
