Federal law requires the California Community Colleges to provide specific information to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for the purpose of filing an information return (IRS Form 1098T "Tuition Statement") for each student in attendance, with a few exceptions. The information required by the IRS includes the student's name, address, Social Security Number (SSN) or Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN/iTIN), and enrollment status, as well as the amount of tuition paid or billed, and scholarships received. (26 C.F.R. 1-60505-1(b)(2)(ii).) Failure to provide a correct Social Security Number or TIN while claiming tax credits for specified education expenses may result in a penalty levied against the student by the IRS in the amount of \$100, per year, until the missing or incorrect information is provided (26 C.F.R. 160505-1(e)(4))			

Missing Social Security Number

- FAFSA will not get linked to students account
- California College Promise Grant (BOG fee waiver) will not auto-package
- Student will not get picked up for packaging or be sent communication regarding missing documentation
- Will cause a delay in financial aid awarding
- This does not affect Dream Act applicants

California residency

- FAFSA applicants- If not answered correctly affects CCPG awarding
- Requires student to take additional steps to correct residency status at the college

Types of documents required to show proof of intent:

You must provide three proofs of residency demonstrating physical presence and intent. Two of the three must be dated as least one year and one day prior to the start of the term for which you are applying. These items must not be older than two years prior to the start of the term. Examples of appropriate documentation include:

- California voter's registration card
- California (540) tax returns giving California as the home address (with acceptable dates)
- Paycheck stub OR letter of employment verification on company letterhead (signed by a manager of the personnel department)
- California Driver's License OR California ID card OR DMV printout
- California Bank account checking or savings statements
- Marriage license or divorce decree issued in California
- License or certificate issued by the State (with issue & expiration dates)
- California utility bill (DWP, gas, telephone, cable all utility bills count as one proof)
- California State Aid or Social Welfare
- California vehicle registration and/or car insurance (California company)
- California health insurance OR Medi-Cal ID
- Military discharge papers (DD214) OR Leave and Earnings statement (indicating California as Home of Record)
- California property taxes (student's name only)
- Union membership in a California local
- California apartment/home lease or rental agreement (1 year current)
- California public library membership (verified by letter or printout with letterhead or branch stamp).

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Once you receive financial aid, you must maintain your eligibility. Your grades and academic progress matter! The Department of Education requires students who apply for financial assistance meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress Standard.

- 2.0 minimum cumulative GPA
- 67% Pace of Progression (W's, F's, NC's, I's affect this)
 - Greater than 50% for the CCPG Fee waiver
- Complete program without exceeding the Maximum Time Frame of 150% of the published length of the program
