

- -I wanted to really know what the kids were feeling beyond the survey
- -I wanted to personalize the data and use to to **better my programs and support services**
- -At first I didn't know where to begin-that is why I am here, for those of you that might be in the same boat as I was just a few years ago.

A Case for Connectedness

Klem and Connell (2004) provide a frightening statistic in this regard, noting that

By high school, as many as 40 to 60 percent of all students—urban, suburban, and rural—are chronically disengaged from school.



California Healthy Kids Survey

Given to 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th graders biannually or annually

Provides information about climate, bullying, alcohol and drug use and safety

Hard to compare apples to apples since it is given every two years so results are not apples to apples

Only get information back for one grade level

Anonymous



Panorama Survey

Given to all students, yearly

Can compare longitudinal data of same kids to measure "real time" growth

Can drill down to the specific student response

Easy to share with staff

Web-based dashboard

Free-response questions





- Two things that I like about the school is 1. that all **teachers** and **staff** just love talking with the **students** 2.that they try their best to keep us safe, and to improve this school



Student Focus Groups and CHKS:

The Process

Told the kids before they took the survey I was going to conduct focus groups

Had the teachers that administered the CHKS send me groups of 8 kids each period

Let the teachers choose the sample of kids. Only requirement was that the kids were willing to participate

Met with the kids in conference room and spent the period getting feedback on key areas of the survey

Shared results with administration

Offline Day

Started with only 6th grade

Periods 1-5

Kids spent the whole day in "families" of 30 (teacher signed up to facilitate family)

Each family had something to symbolize who they were

Hats, jewelry, pins, lay, etc.

Each family developed a Coat of Arms and family name

4 quadrants-fears, joys, goal....

Center of Support Activity

If you really knew me activity





Offline Day Periods 1-5 Center of Kids spent the whole day in Support "families" of 30 Activity (teacher signed Started up to facilitate with 6th family) grade "If you really knew me" Family Name activity and Coat of Arms

Offline Day 2

Later in the year students spent 2 periods with their original families and did empathy activities

Ice Breakers:

Finish this sentence:

By the time i leave here today i hope to..... One goal that i have next school year is.....

Skittle ice breaker:

Each color represents different sentence frames I enjoy, I want, I love, I hate, I am, I feel...

Activities:

60 second eye-to-eye contact in silence to foster connection with another student Self reflection activity:

What they were proud of and what they would like to improve Letter to self:

Where do they see themselves in 8th grade, activities, grow..goals.

Process Data:

- Approx. 270 students
- <u>6</u> classes
- <u>1</u> school day (across a science class)

Lesson Purpose:

- Whole presentation is geared towards what a La Quinta Middle STEM Academy student looks like and acts like
- Family feel
- Common bond and commitment to each other

Teacher follows up with classroom discussions to reinforce ideas and concepts

Student Needs Assessment

1 teacher at each grade level shares out google survey with all kids to request counseling

Survey allows students to request tier 2 or 3 services

The student chooses which services they would like and how they would like to receive them

Sift through the data to create groups


Also use the data to understand how to serve our students better

Student Focus Groups Findings

Connectedness, Respect, Safety were key indicators/issues

PSST world, blind spots, back fields

Grade level team building/connectedness activities

Teacher-Student Relationships (gave teachers much larger role in offline day)



Administration Buy-In

Met with admin to discuss results of school focus groups

PSST world, blind spots, back fields

Grade level team building/connectedness activities after every major holiday

Teacher-Student Relationships (gave teachers much larger role in offline day)


PSST world was added to all admin classroom discussion and placed on admin blog




