- 2. Visit the ASC (DSPS) Cranium Café Virtual Lobby here: <u>https://msjc.craniumcafe.com/lobby</u> Here an ASC Staff member will assist you with filling out our application packet and schedule you with one of our counsellors
- **3.** Attend your intake appointment. During your intake appointment, a counselor will review your documentation and use that along with the conversation they have with you to determine which accommodations you are eligible for.

FYE Counselors will ensure you stay on for graduation, you are on the right path to transfer, and that you are connecting to the college culture by meeting with an FYE Student Mentor. You can receive academic, career, transfer, personal, and crisis counseling at our office.



FYE Mentors




A dedicated team of FYE Mentors who are students like you but with experience, are here to help YOU! FYE Mentors work with incoming students to build effective study habits, navigate the college process and technology, and direct students to the various programs and services offered on campus. FYE students are able to connect with a mentor via MSJC email, Zoom online meetings and later, face-to-face.

First Year Experience and Guided Pathways

Orientation (Explain clear curriculum pathways to a career & employment) *First Year Experience Counselors and Mentors* (Help you choose and enter a pathway) *Learning Community Courses* (Help you stay on path) *Student Success Seminar Non-Credit College Course FYE Faculty* (Ensure that YOUR learning is happening) *Field Trips to Colleges and Universities Guest Speakers*





• Students who participate in the First Year Experience Program (FYE) successfully complete transfer-level English and college-level math than students who did not participate in FYE.

• FYE students reach to 30-units faster than students who do not participate in FYE.



- FYE students are twice as likely to earn their associate degrees within a three-year time period than students who are not in FYE.
- FYE students are more likely to persist into their second year at Mt. San Jacinto College than students who are not in FYE.
- Last, FYE students are more likely to transfer to 4-year universities than students who did not participate in FYE.







What is the difference between a Certificate and a Degree?

- Certificate(s) include specific courses in a professional / technical field
- A Certificate generally takes two years or less to complete (major courses only)
- An Associate Degree requires additional General Education (Math, English, Science, etc.)
- Associate Degrees may be in a career/technical field or for university transfer

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)

EMS (EMS-501)

Counselor Considerations

 Math and English placement - encourage your students to complete the highest levels possible, especially for the following majors:

*Business

*Computer Science

*Any other STEM majors

Emphasize with students the importance of meeting with their Pathways Counselor
 1-3 times PER semester



Counselor Considerations

• College course credit - encourage high school students to complete coursework that will count for early college credit

*Dual enrollment credits (ensures college credit)

*Articulation Credit

*AP / IB exams (not as guaranteed as Dual Enrollment)

- Ensure that students orders final scores and/or final transcripts and have them sent to MSJC
- Understand that the receiving institution is the one that determines how credit is awarded
