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## Pre-AP Arts: Documenting the Process of Thinking and Creating

#### Available in-person

In the Pre-AP Arts classroom, teachers help students record their creative processes and reflect on the development of their artistic works. This workshop is based on the idea that students who are reflective about their artistic choices become adept in building skills in their disciplines. Participants learn how to get students to trace the evolution of their thinking, including idea generation, ongoing revision and refinement, and presentation of their work for an audience. Workshop activities include an examination of the Pre-AP Visual and Performing Arts course framework, as well as work with formative assessments, inquiry-led dialogues, and exploratory critiques.

## Pre-AP Arts: Facilitating Risk-Taking, Inventiveness, and Experimentation

#### Available in-person

The Pre-AP Arts classroom facilitates risk-taking, inventiveness, and experimentation, so students can engage more deeply in the visual and performing art creative process. This workshop shows how trial-and-error supports students who are more confident and willing to improve their skills. Participants learn how to provide guided, structured opportunities for student choice and agency in each phase of the creative process.

## Pre-AP English: Texts Take Center Stage

#### Available in-person and virtually

Texts take center stage in the Pre-AP English classroom, inspiring and preparing all students for close, critical reading. This virtual workshop addresses the three areas of focus for Pre-AP English: reading closely, valuing evidence, and noticing language choices. Through engagement with model lessons, participants will explore how these areas of focus help the reader observe the small details within a text to arrive at a deeper understanding of the whole.

## Pre-AP Mathematics: Developing Mathematical Knowledge Within a Learner-Centered Classroom

#### Available in-person and virtually

A learner-centered approach helps support student engagement with critical content in the Pre-AP math classroom. In this virtual workshop, participants examine the characteristics of an engaging, learner-centered mathematics classroom through the lens of the Pre-AP shared principles and mathematics areas of focus. Participants will actively engage in a Pre-AP model lesson focused on building a safe classroom environment where students access critical content through close observation and analysis, higher-order questioning, evidence-based writing, academic conversation, and mathematical argumentation.

# Pre-AP Science: Building Conceptual Understanding using Analytical Reading and Writing

#### Available in-person and virtually

Pre-AP shared principles and science areas of focus work together to allow students to gain, retain, and apply scientific knowledge. In this workshop, participants actively engage in a Pre-AP model lesson with an emphasis on analytical reading and writing. They will practice using the Pre-AP shared principles to promote understanding of content area text and scientific reasoning and justification. Participants will then consider how they can apply new learning within their own classroom context, to support students as they become discerning citizens and consumers of scientific information.

# **Pre-AP Social Studies: Fostering Disciplinary Skills**

#### Available in-person and virtually

Concepts and skills that have maximum value for high school, college, careers, and civic life are a feature in Pre-AP social studies. This virtual workshop addresses three areas of focus that prepare students through disciplinary apprenticeship: evaluating evidence, incorporating evidence, and explaining historical and geographic relationships. Through engagement with model lessons, participants will explore how these areas of focus, in partnership with the Pre-AP shared principles, help all students work with primary and secondary sources in the way that historians do.

# Pre-AP World Language and Culture: Applying Pre-AP Shared Principles

#### Available in-person

In this workshop, participants examine the Pre-AP shared principles and explore how educators can integrate them into any world language classroom. Participants will have the opportunity to examine AP Themes of World Language and Culture and consider how to integrate them into their current work with students.
