AVID/Senior Seminar/TOK

- Why we started Senior Seminar
 - Started 8 years ago
 - Parents questioning why AVID kids were given more support than non-AVID kids
 - Principal/counseling/AVID Coordinator wanted school-wide support for seniors
 - We wanted all Seniors to have a plan after high school
 - Other subject's time was being used to complete FAFSA/Applications etc.
 - Hurts the students and frustrates teachers

How We Created the Course

- The AVID Coordinator went through all of the AVID curriculum for seniors of what all students need to know
- AVID Coordinator met with the head counselor to see what the counseling department would like to be covered in the course (FAFSA, College APPS, etc)
- Then as a team, we went though life skills that are important (job apps, interviewing, CSAC, reading financial aid packages, making your college schedule)
- The AVID coordinator piloted the program for the first year
- Then, the Coordinator created a curriculum that the students would complete
- All counseling meetings with students would go through this course to help alleviate stress from Gov't/Econ and Senior English
- All college presentations would go through Senior Seminar to help avoid class-time loss

FAFSA/Dream Success

- Every senior must take Senior Seminar/AVID or TOK
 - The teachers in these courses help the students step-by-step to complete their FAFSA/Dream ACT.
 This is a part of the curriculum and it is a grade in the class.
 - The counselors publicize the completion results by period and teacher, to make it a class competition and the first class to get 100% gets breakfast or lunch.
 - The winning teacher gets a gift card.
 - After we have pushed the FAFSA for 1 month, the teachers begin emailing the counselors the names of the students who are having a hard time, not bringing in info, parents are refusing, etc. The counselors then call in the student and work with them one-on-one.
