1) Credit: Scout does not offer transcripts for Basic or Plus courses, but WASC has authorized Scout to issue transcripts for Premium and On Demand courses.
 Students wishing to receive credit for Basic or Plus courses must discuss how credit will be issued with their school counselors before enrolling. The process for getting credit for a Basic or Plus course involves your school adding the Scout course to its a-g list. Then, the course can show up on your high school transcript. Students who want their Premium or On Demand course to show up on their high school transcript need to coordinate with their school counselor and follow the same process of having the Scout course added to the school's a-g list.

2) Wet Lab Requirements: California students interested in "a-g" credit must complete 20 percent of the course in the form of a hands-on wet lab (25% for AP[®] courses). Students' schools must be able to provide lab space. Students who do not complete lab requirements will receive grade recommendations that clearly indicate that the labs were not completed.
