- Keeping student options open!!!







AB-469

- Begins the 2022–23 academic year
- Requirement for LEAs to confirm that their seniors complete either the FAFSA or California Dream Act
- Student is able to "opt out"

How are we going to track this?





Senior Master List

- Living Google Sheet (updated almost daily)
- Counselors update their own caseloads

What goes on the Senior Master List?

- All student information (including student cell #'s/student emails)
- Academic GPA
- Credits completed/on track for grad
- A-G on track
- College and Career prepared on track
- Special Programs (AVID/TRIO/EAOP)
- FAFSA Completion Y or N/opt-out signed
- College applications completed
- College acceptances



Systems for Financial Aid Competition

 - Update Senior Master List
- Financial Aid: Annual Student Outcome Goal
 - Even though NOT ASCA, just an extra goal
- Financial Aid as Part of Senior Project Grade
- Cash for College Parent Night

- College Kick Off
 - College Kick Off Worksheet
- Weekly Financial Aid Workshops
 - FSA ld
 - Financial Aid Applications
- Phone Calls and Follow Up
- Financial Aid Opt Out
 - Meeting with SC, parent and student

- Incentives
- Clean up Matching Issues
- Graduation Requirements
- Embedded in Culture "All Hands on Deck"
- Work with Alt Ed school
- Before transfer of school MUST have financial aid complete!
- Collection of personal e-mail/cell numbers
- FAFSA Fridays
- Support System







All Hands on Deck!!!


- Counselors: meeting with students, contacting parents, visiting classes, hosting workshops
- Administration: including district administration reaching out to families
- Teachers: senior teachers provide time in the schedule to work on FAFSA
- Office Staff: reviewing and updating data
- Parents: attending workshops, providing information
- Students: working on the application
- CalSOAP Staff: working with student and staff






Financial Aid Linked Lessons


