*** If a student enrolls in Concert Band as an elective, they will have health and Marching Band PE 7th period for the first semester and Beginning Band for the second semester.

Due to graduation requirements, incoming freshmen have limited choices with regards to elective courses. As your student progresses through high school however, they will have more opportunities for elective coursework.

Registration Procedures

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

The *Santiago Shark Scheduler* lists important registration dates and information such as course descriptions, prerequisites and graduation requirements. It will contain all necessary information pertaining to 9th grade scheduling at Santiago High School. Students are to review this information with parents and current teachers. The course selection sheet needs to be completed before the student meets with the counselor.

Course Selection Advisement

Course selection sheets must be filled out and signed by the parent/guardian and the student. Course Selection sheet to their current school counselor and it will be forwarded to Santiago. Please make every effort to attend on your scheduled date. If you need further assistance, see your current school counselor and/or teachers.

Santiago Counselors are very excited that we will be meeting with students and parents in May / June to discuss strategies for success in high school especially in regards to the classes that they have selected for the upcoming year. Post-graduation plans will also be discussed.

Students <u>select 6 classes</u> for their freshman year. Check the class that you are selecting by completing both 1st and 2nd semester course selections. Yearlong courses will be taken both semesters. Courses followed by A/B or (Y) are yearlong courses and courses followed by (S) are semester courses. **Two** semester courses must be selected to fill the schedule for the year.

All honors level courses are yearlong commitments

Please select honors courses wisely as they are yearlong commitments. It is your responsibility to complete any summer reading assignments to prepare for the coursework. If you wish to sign up for an honors level course, you should be currently earning an "A" or "B" in your regular level course or a "C" or better in an honors level course. High school honors courses are rigorous and designed to prepare students to move into Advanced Placement courses taken in their junior and senior years. Students planning to apply to competitive 4-year colleges need to consider taking honor courses.

World Language

If you are planning to attend college, it is highly recommended that you sign up for a world language course. Students should currently have a G.P.A. of 3.0 or above to take a world language in your freshman year.

Alternate courses

List at least three alternate courses in case your first choice is not available.

Registration Dates

Registration packets should come in the mail in June. Information is also available online and you will be able to update your student's emergency card on the Parent Portal. Be sure to read all of the instructions and information in the packet and plan to attend your scheduled registration day with all of the completed paperwork.

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




